Re: Remaining H1N1 Vaccination Clinics

The Burlington County Health Department would like to thank the thousands of parents and children in the county for their assistance in limiting the spread of the 2009 H1N1 flu virus in our schools. Almost 30,000 H1N1 vaccinations were given in the schools right here in Burlington County. Because of your actions, we were able to help protect the health and well-being of many of our county residents.

For those of you that have not received the vaccine yet, the Burlington County Health Department will be having free walk-in clinics at the Health Department (15 Pioneer Blvd, Westampton, NJ 08060) through Friday, April 9<sup>th</sup>. The walk-in clinic hours are as follows:

Mondays, 4:00pm – 6:30pm  
Thursdays, 8:30am – 1:00pm  
Fridays, 1:00pm – 4:00pm

As the weather turns nice, the flu may become less of a concern to many parents. However, H1N1 vaccination remains a good idea for this very preventable and sometimes serious disease. The virus does continue to circulate, causing illness, hospitalizations and deaths. Vaccination remains the only sure way to prevent the disease and none of us can say exactly what we'll see in the weeks and months ahead.
